



New Jersey Provider Technology Requirements

New Jersey is requiring providers to provide information regarding technology used within their practices.

1. What information is the State of New Jersey requiring?

- CERT: Certified Electronic Health Record Technology
- CMSPIP: CMS Promoting Interoperability Program
- HIE: Health Information Exchange

2. How can providers update this information?

- New providers to the network will indicate this information on their application.
- Current providers will enter the information via the survey link on Provider Express.

3. What if the provider does not use CEHRT with Optum?

- Provider may not use CEHRT with Optum but may use it with other insurers. Any use of CHERT would be a YES response.

4. What if the provider is unsure about their CMSPIP response?

- The Contractor shall indicate (Y or N) if the provider has successfully attested to the CMS Promoting Interoperability Program (formerly Medicaid or Medicare EHR Incentive Program), as specified by the HITECH Act in article 42 U.S.C. 300jj et seq.: 17901 et seq, or for dually eligible providers, if the provider participates in the Medicare Quality Payment Program.

5. What if the provider is unsure about their HIE response?

- The Contractor shall indicate (Y or N) if the provider is actively engaged with or connected to a HIE (Health Information Exchange), TDSO (Trusted Data Sharing Organization) or NJHIN (NJ Health Information Network).
